PURPOSE

Through the Texas Foundations Fund, TSAHC partners with nonprofit organizations across Texas to assist very low-income households with a disability and/or located in a rural community. To date TSAHC has invested more than \$3.2 million to support the following:

- Home repairs and accessibility modifications in owner-occupied homes
- Supportive housing services, such as case management, mental health counseling and adult education, for households at risk of homelessness

ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS

Applicant must be a nonprofit organization with a 501(c)(3) designation from the Internal Revenue Service. Applicants must have at least three years of experience operating housing programs in Texas, and have at least two years of experience operating the program for which a matching grant will be requested. Applicant must provide a letter of reference or support from a funder who has supported the program for which a matching grant will be requested. Additional information regarding eligibility requirements can be found in the application guide, listed in the left-side column.


ELIGIBLE ACTIVITIES

Programs that provide the following housing services are eligible for a matching grant from the Texas Foundations Fund:


- The rehabilitation and/or critical repair of single family homes to remedy unsafe living conditions. This may consist of critical repairs and may also include accessibility modifications for homes with a household member with a disability. Homes receiving repairs must be owner-occupied.
- The provision of supportive housing services that help individuals and families at risk of homelessness or unnecessary institutionalization gain and maintain their housing stability. Eligible supportive housing services include, but are not limited to: the provision of alcohol and drug counseling; adult education and/or job training; mental health counseling; and/or case management or services provided by a health care providers.


Historical Number of Applicants per Cycle:




Historical Number of Awards per Cycle:




Historical % of Applicants Awarded per Cycle:
