## GUILLEN, OTHER STATE LEGISLATORS DISCUSS HEALTH POLICY AT NATIONAL CONFERENCE

**BOSTON** – On June 9-11 in Boston, MA, the National Hispanic Caucus of State Legislators hosted its 11th annual Promoting Healthy Lifestyles Symposium. At the conference, State Representative Ryan Guillen (D - District 31) and other members from across the nation met to discuss key issues related to promoting health and wellness in our communities. The theme of this year's conference was "Finding A Match: Solutions For Strengthening The Transplant System."
