SUMMARY

The Highway Bridge Program (HBP) is a federal-aid program that provides funding to enable states to improve the condition of highway bridges through replacement, rehabilitation and systematic preventive maintenance. The Bridge Division is responsible for administering this program.

DESCRIPTION

Bridge projects are selected and programmed in four-year cycles that run continuously. This means that each year, a new four-year program is established, made up of the previous three years of already programmed bridges, plus additional bridges now able to be programmed in the fourth year.

ELIGIBLE CANDIDATES

Eligible structures for address under equivalent-match projects must meet the following criteria:

- 1) Meet the Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) bridge classification for deficient
- 2) Include main-lane cross-drainage structures and low-water crossings that do not meet the FHWA bridge definition but are deficient
- 3) The equivalent-match bridge or main-lane cross-drainage structure must be classified as deficient or be weight-restricted for school buses
