GUILLEN LEADS STATE OFFICIALS ON VALLEY TOUR

Rio Grande Valley Partnership hosts State Representatives, Senators

AUSTIN - At the start of the new legislative session, State Representative Ryan Guillen (D-Rural South Texas) helped host over 20 of his colleagues for the Rio Grande Valley (RGV) Partnership Legislative Tour. This tour marks the 21st Legislative Tour of the Rio Grande Valley highlighting valley area growth and the needs of the area going foraward.

"In order for us to be effective as legislative leaders, it is imperative that we articulate to members of the Texas House and Senate the challenges and opportunities that are unique to the region," said Guillen.

The RGV tour was organized by the RGV Partnership, working with sponsors, the skill developing University of Texas RGV, Representative Ryan Guillen and local business leaders. It is aimed at providing legislators throughout the state a first-hand look at challenges, opportunities, and success in the fields of education, infrastructure, transportation, healthcare, manufacturing, agriculture and international relations in the region. Texas lawmakers toured key sites in Cameron and Willacy Counties this year.
